Health & Safety Statement
August 2016

The Crystal Therapy Council (CTC) recognises that healthy and safe teaching conditions are vital to achieving teaching and learning excellence. CTC registrants therefore aim to conduct their courses in a way that presents no risk of injury or ill health to its tutors or students and gives rise to no damage to any equipment, materials or any other property as a result of accidents, fires or dangerous occurrences.

This is a process of continuous improvement and relies primarily on the systematic identification, assessment and control of hazards and risks, underpinned by awareness of the relevant legislative requirements.

The success of this policy requires the involvement and commitment of everybody involved. CTC registrants and their tutors take a primary responsibility to ensure the implementation and maintenance of health and safety controls and procedures.

CTC requires everybody involved in courses to teach, study and practice in a way which presents no risk to themselves or others.

CTC requires schools on the register and their tutors to ensure they are up to date with current practice that they have sufficient information, instruction and training to carry out their teaching activities and responsibilities.

Every tutor of a CTC registrant has an obligation to operate in the day-to-day implementation of this policy and to take reasonable care for their own health and safety and the safety of other people who may be affected by their acts or omissions.
